## 5TH GRADE BAND - PRE CONCERT ASSIGNMENT

- Select an adult (preferably a non-musician) or family member that will be at the 11/30 concert.
- Teach this person to play Page 8 # 19 “Hot Cross Buns” on your instrument.
- Remember to teach them the basics including note reading, rhythm, playing position, embouchure (tone production), and fingerings.
- During the concert this person will come on stage and “perform” Hot Cross Buns with the other selected adults.

### Cleaning/Sanitizing Instruments

- Trumpet/Trombones/Saxophone/Clarinet - wash your mouthpiece with warm soap and water and dry with a paper towel. “Green” antiseptic spray will be available during the concert.
- Saxophone/Clarinet - dip the reed in warm soapy water or mouthwash. You may want to set aside a separate reed specifically for this person!
- Flute - Dip a washcloth/paper towel into warm soapy water and wipe the tone hole.
