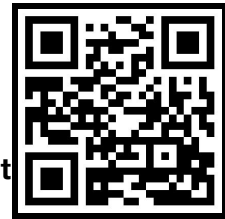

COURSE DESCRIPTION

Band instruction in the sixth grade is built upon the fundamentals learned in the fifth grade. Students entering sixth grade band that have not completed the Coopersville fifth grade band program will need to create a plan with the band directors to ensure his or her success. Students participate in two performances throughout the school year, the Holiday concert and Spring Concert. Because this is a performance-based class, we ask for a yearlong commitment.

GOALS & OBJECTIVES

Students will be able to:

- Play major scales and arpeggios in the keys of concert Bb, Eb, F, Ab.
- Play a 1 octave chromatic scale.
- Read rhythms using note and rest values from whole notes through sixteenth notes including dotted rhythms.
- Time Signatures include 4/4, 3/4, cut time, and 6/8 time.
- Proper posture, breathing, tone quality, and hand position for their instrument are reinforced.
- Successfully perform beginner/intermediate-level band repertoire, demonstrating the proper use of dynamics, articulation, phrasing, and notation.

GRADING:

Concerts	300-500 each
Daily Rehearsals	20 points
Playing Tests	50 each
Class Assignments	50 each
Extra Credit/Help	30 each

Concerts: Students are graded on attendance, punctuality, being in uniform, having all materials, following instructions, and demonstration of proper audience and stage etiquette. Every member of the band is essential, which is why attendance is required at all concerts unless it is indicated as a volunteer activity. If a student must miss a performance for any reason please email Mrs. Borst as soon as possible. Excused absences will be handled on a case by case basis. Students are expected to report 30 minutes prior to every band concert in the high school band room.

Daily Rehearsals Rehearsals: Students are graded on coming to class with all necessary materials every day (instrument, music/book/folder, pencil, reeds, mouthpiece) and demonstrating good rehearsal skills by following classroom rehearsal expectations. *Students are expected to write notes given by the teachers into their music with a pencil.*

Playing Tests: Students are graded on both playing and written tests. Students will record their playing tests using their chromebooks. Students **MAY** retake all playing tests (please note that retakes will not change chair order). Students may also submit recordings for test retakes.

GOOGLE CLASSROOM:

All students will join the google classroom page. Students will use google classroom to submit playing tests and other assignments.

UNIFORM

The 6th grade students do not have a concert uniform. Students are expected to wear nice, school appropriate clothes to all concerts. Please no shorts or jeans.

BAND EXPECTATIONS

- **BE NICE!** This means be positive, respect your peers and teachers and never use mean words.
- **TRY!** Never give up. Be ready to play. Mark your music as asked. We will never give up on you and never be afraid to ask for extra help!
- **BE PREPARED DAILY:** Bring your instrument, book, sheet music/folder, pencil, reeds (woodwinds), sticks (percussion), mouthpiece (brass), and brain! ☺
- **CONTROL YOUR VOICE:** No “extra” noises or sounds. Do not yell at anyone.
- **Immediately get instrument ready upon entering the room.**
 - Always be ready to play when the baton is up and be silent after the cut off.
- **Only touch items that YOU own (or that are signed out to you).**
- **Please dispose of gum. Food should be finished in the hallway. Water is okay, but be careful around instruments.**
- **Do your best to not interrupt rehearsal. This means use the bathroom during passing time (the pass is for emergencies), use your filter instead of blurting out, take care of reed/music/instrument issues before or after class and not during instructional time.**

OTHER WAYS TO HELP YOUR CHILD IN BAND:

1. Encourage your child to practice. This is “band homework”. Help develop a routine of practice by setting aside a specific time each evening for practice.
2. Provide a quiet, comfortable place to practice without distractions.
3. Consider purchasing a supplemental music collection for your child’s individual instrument. These include pop, rock, movie themes, Christian, holiday etc. They are available at local music stores and online. Supplemental books make great gifts!
4. Encourage your child to perform a mini concert for you and other family members at home. This can also help students overcome nerves.
5. Whenever possible go to concerts, musical events, and listen to recordings that feature your child’s instrument.
6. Attend your child’s band concerts and discuss proper concert behavior with your child. A schedule of events is included in this handout. Mark your calendar and try to keep those dates clear.
7. Consider attending a Bronco Band Booster meeting or volunteering for band events!
